

Q.1 Can you share how the Leader in Me program has been implemented in the senior section? What are some key strategies you have used to engage the students?

The Leader in Me program in the senior section integrates the 7 Habits into academics and extracurriculars. Key strategies include leadership roles in clubs, student-led projects, peer mentorship, and workshops on skills like public speaking and time management, allowing students to build practical leadership abilities.


