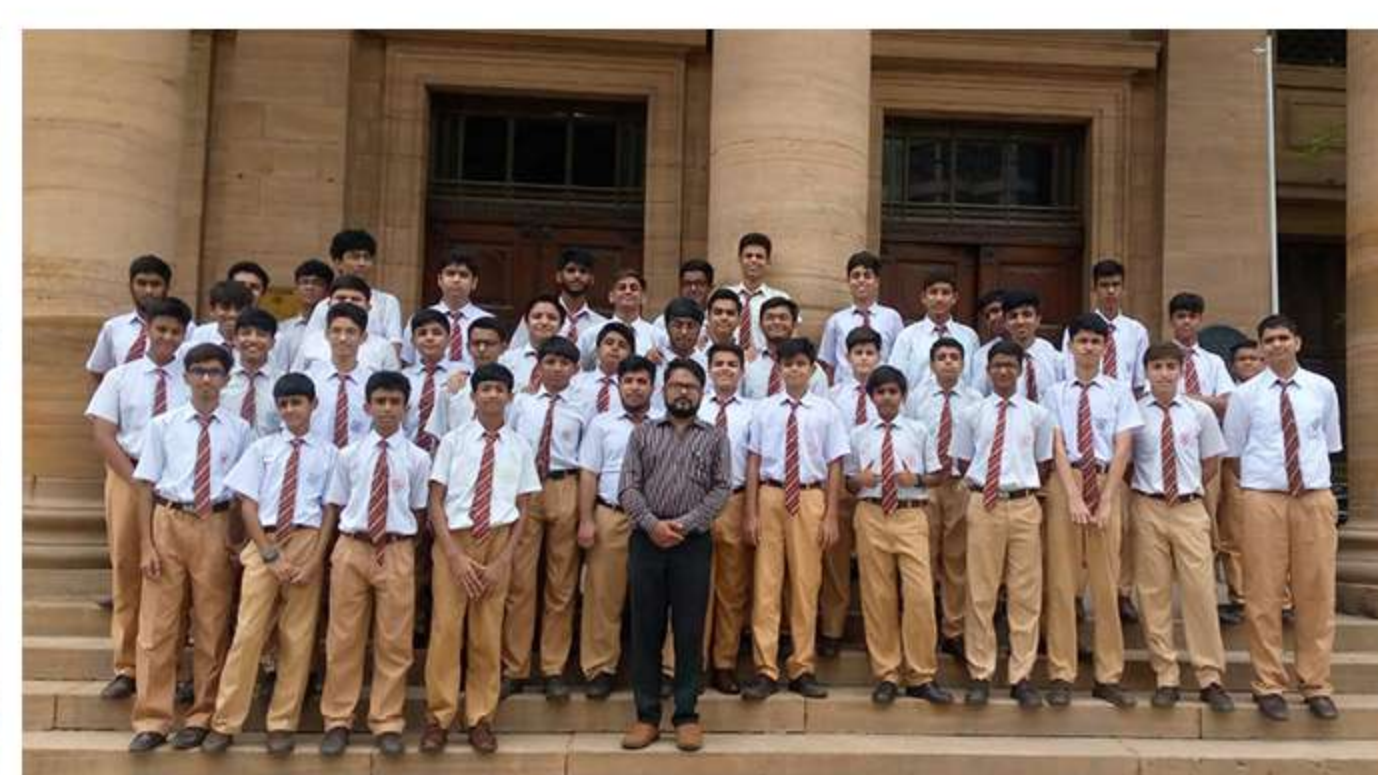
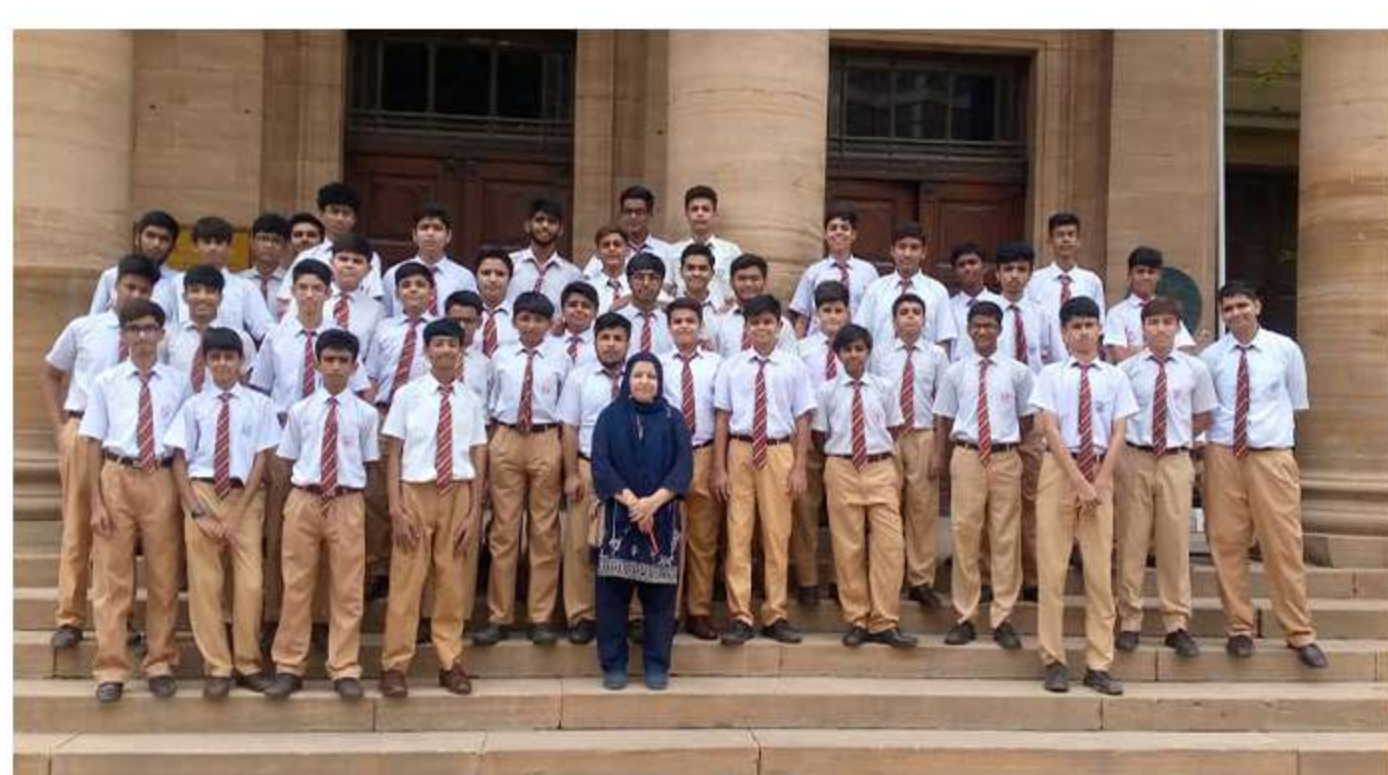
## DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD – GOLD LEVEL ACTIVITY
